## Dean of Students (DOS) Office: Maureen Armstrong, Associate Dean of Students/Director

- Food Insecurity
  - o Currently, the University does not have a food pantry on the Storrs campus
  - o Food pantries are available within the Faith community and the Town of Mansfield, which students are referred to
  - o Two committees have been formed to further discuss the topic of food insecurity at UConn, one from Student Affairs and one from the Provosts office.
  - o University administration is working to partner with student government individuals
  - o Swipe Out Hunger- a nation-wide program that partners with colleges to help put an end to student hunger and assist those who struggle with food insecurity
    - <u>UConn Swipes Program</u>- aims to provide students who are food insecure, and/or who are
      experiencing an emergency situation, access to healthy and well-balanced meals in our
      campus dining halls. To be eligible, students must be currently enrolled at UConn
      - UConn Swipes Program does not require an application, instead it requires a
        meeting with an Assistant Dean of Students and needs assessment to determine
        the individuals' level of food insecurity. The needs assessment is completed at the
        time of the meeting.
      - On 10/16 and 12/4, student will be able to donate their swipes to the "Give a Meal" initiative a the Dining Halls
- DOS Resources
  - Students First Fund- created by the Division of Student Affairs and is supported by private donations. Students who have experienced an **unanticipated hardship** may receive a gift through the fund to help ease the burden they may be experiencing. By providing resources in time of need, the Students First Fund allows the Division of Student Affairs to demonstrate the care and concern they have for students, reminding them that they are an important and valuable part of the UConn community.
